

The Show

Air travel will take on dramatic new life this summer as Ontario's **Circus Orange** takes flight at the **Canadian National Exhibition** (CNE) nightly in **Jump Jet**, a stunning outdoor high flying circus extravaganza.

The 20 minute pyrotechnic, acrobatic and circus theatre performance, which unfolds in three acts set to original music, makes its Ontario debut at the CNE. Each night of the fair, CNE visitors will be mesmerized by *Jump Jet's* spectacular aerial splendour.

The Storyline

As the show begins, an army of characters clad in orange jump suits are working furiously to repair and re-fuel machines, creating showers of sparks and fire. Meanwhile, fellow performers engage in acrobatic pre-flight preparations. Finally everything is completed and the countdown begins. Selected members of the audience are walked through a large metal detector and comically scanned for items not allowed on the flight. Buzzers go off and items are confiscated; one man loses his banana!

Once this process has been completed, air controllers take their positions, and in an amazing display of pyrotechnic choreography, guide the Jump Jet co-pilots on a phenomenal journey.

Slowly the dramatic flying machine rises into the night sky, a vision to behold as long columns of fire propel the jet upwards. Once it reaches altitude, the female pilot, a solitary figure in white, is suspended from the jet in a dramatic static trapeze act that is punctuated by pyrotechnic highlights as she scatters silver flutterfetti into the sky.

As the momentum builds, the jet rises further into the air but suddenly experiences turbulence forcing the female pilot to eject herself jumping 70 feet downward in a spectacular aerial bungee performance. Trampoline artists on the ground respond by jumping up towards her firing pyro flares. The extraordinary multi-level extravaganza culminates in dramatic high elevation fireworks that explode in a dazzling pyrotechnical finale.

Over the decades, it has evolved into a uniquely Canadian performance enjoyed by tens of thousands of spectators each year.





Quilt of Belonging

The magnificent **Quilt of Belonging**, the largest collaborative work of textile art to be created on a national scale, will be on display for all to experience every day of the 2008 CNE. With 263 squares representing 71 Aboriginal groups and 192 immigrant nationalities found in Canada, the Quilt is a lasting testimony to Canada's multicultural heritage and identity.

To produce this landmark project, each group was invited to produce a handmade block featuring textiles and symbols that represent its unique contribution to the Canadian mosaic. Grand in size and purpose, the finished quilt measures 36 metres (120 feet) long by 3.5 metres (10 feet) high. In the words of the project coordinator, artist Esther Bryant, "Our vision was to create a collaborative work of art that will recognize Canada's and the world's diversity, celebrate our common humanity, and promote harmony and compassion among people."

The *Quilt of Belonging* made its debut at the Canadian Museum of Civilization in Gatineau, Quebec in April 2005. Most recently, it has been exhibited to great acclaim at the International Quilt Festival in Houston, Texas; the Glenbow Museum in Calgary, Alberta, and the Woodlands Cultural Centre in Brantford, Ontario

100 Years of Anne

The Garden Show, Heritage Court, Direct Energy Centre





The **Lucy Maud Montgomery Society of Ontario** (LMMSO) and **Uxbridge Township** in association with **Gribble Landscape Creations** (GLC) bring to the CNE a fascinating tribute to this popular Canadian author in an exhibit celebrating her many literary accomplishments as well as her love of the garden. Her most famous novel, *Anne of Green Gables* (first published in 1908) celebrates its 100th anniversary this year.

The enchanting CNE exhibit will showcase the author's writing and photography, her love of gardens through beautiful landscape installations, her life at Leaskdale, Ontario and the world of her most famous heroine: **Anne Shirley, Anne of Green Gables**.

Born in Prince Edward Island in 1874, L.M. Montgomery started writing the Anne books in her native province. Upon her marriage to Rev. Ewan Macdonald in the summer of 1911, they moved to the hamlet of Leaskdale in the Township of Uxbridge, Ontario, where he had become the minister of St. Paul's Presbyterian Church the previous year. It was during her life at the Leaskdale Manse that Lucy Maud Montgomery set up housekeeping, raised her children, and wrote 11 of her 22 books including: *Anne of the Island* (1915), *Anne's House of Dreams* (1917), *Rainbow Valley* (1919), *Rilla of Ingleside* (1920) *Emily of New Moon* (1923), *Emily Climbs*, (1925) and *The Blue Castle* (1926).

AGRICULTURE DURING THE CNE

Ambassador of the Fairs Competition

For 37 years, young representatives from fairs across Ontario have competed to become the Ambassador of the Fairs. This year-long title takes the winner across Ontario as a representative of the CNE and all agricultural fairs. Since its inception in 1971, more than 1300 young people from 100 communities throughout the province have taken part in this illustrious contest. This year the event takes place at the CNE from August 15th to August 17th, with the winner being crowned the Sunday afternoon (August 17th) in the Queen Elizabeth Theatre.

The Farm

CNE Better Living Centre (West Side)

Ongoing daily

Just minutes away from the intense urban landscape of Toronto, rural Ontario comes to life for 18 days at the CNE in the Better Living Centre. The CNE's Farm provides visitors with the chance to slow down and get acquainted with rural life including a wide variety of farm yard animals ranging from piglets to ostriches. Guests can be a farmer for a day, picking apples off a tree, digging for potatoes, milking a cow and collecting eggs from the chickens.

There will also be daily demonstrations of butter making, weaving, rope making, sheep shearing and cow & goat milking. A large sand sculpture will also be featured this summer in The Farm constructed in the shape of **Noah's Ark**. The Farm has been a central part of the CNE the past 18 years, and this year has a new home in the west side of the Better Living Centre. It has moved out of the Automotive Building due to the construction of the new Conference Centre within the historic edifice.

Kids' AqVenture

A huge hit at the CNE last year, Kids AgVenture, a colourful and engaging interactive area, designed for children ages three to ten years of age returns in 2008. In a journey that takes them through five miniature barns, kids get to experience the life of a farm hand. Each barn provides visitors with "hands on" tasks related to planting crops and tending of animals. For example, at the chicken coop, the farm hands feed the chickens the grain they "harvested" and then collect the eggs. At the dairy barn, the children milk a cow and collect milk cartons. There is also a tractor area, sheep barn, orchard/garden and grain area. After the children have gone through each of the miniature barns and collected their products, they "sell" them at the market for "cash" which they use to purchase a small item. (I.e. Cow ruler or pig eraser)

Sowing the Seeds of Heritage: Life in a Rural Community

This exhibit focuses on the Life in a Rural Community as seen through the church, school, rail station, homestead, general store and farm. CHANGES TO THE CNE & THE SITE IN 2008

Automotive Building

The Automotive Building will be under construction during the 2008 CNE. The historic façade will be retained but the interior will be in the process of being transformed into a state-of-the-art Conference Centre which is scheduled to open in 2009.

The Farm & Cat Show

Due to the construction underway in the Automotive Building, The Farm is moving west into the Better Living's Centre west side, formerly home to SportZone. The Cat show is moving into Café Soleil in the Direct Energy Centre for its duration during the second weekend of the fair.

Sports/SportZone

SportZone will no longer exist as it has been previously known, but Sports Activities will take on a new life in an outdoor village just west of the Food Building which will feature a celebration of the 2008 summer games. Retail outlets including Stitches that formerly lived in SportZone, will be re-located in Hall G in the Direct Energy Centre while smaller retail outlets also in the Better Living Centre will be moving outdoors and to various indoor locations throughout the grounds.

New Stage Outside Heritage Court

A new outdoor stage **(The Maple Lodge Farms Variety Stage)** will be erected south of the Horse Palace, west of Heritage Court and will be home to the hypnotist Mike Mandel, the ventriloquist Michael Harrison and the Rising Star Talent Competitions.

New Stage at South East Corner of Food Building

A new stage for Street Performers will be added to the CNE this year. This stage will feature talented international and local artists who in the past have performed in different designated areas throughout the grounds.

Reconfiguration of Midway

The adult midway is being slightly reconfigured for 2008, exact details to be confirmed.

Global Quest at the EX

There will be no Quest at the EX (an electronic scavenger hunt staged throughout the grounds) at the 2008 CNE. There are a number of reasons for this change. The promotion was originally designed in 2006 to move people around the soccer stadium construction. With the BMO Field now firmly ensconced in the site, and available real estate at a premium due to fact that all the programming and retail that traditionally lived in the Automotive Building and SportZone have had to be moved this year, Quest at the EX is no longer a workable promotion. It was also very labour intensive and had significant costs to the CNE associated with it. Online promotions and online data collection initiatives will be explored to replace it.

MAJOR ANNIVERSARIES

130th Anniversary of the Canadian National Exhibition

Established in 1879, the CNE celebrates its 130th Anniversary in 2008.

Prior to 1879, an annual fair organized by the Provincial Agricultural Association and the Board for Agriculture for Canada West was held in a different Ontario city each year. The success of the 1878 Fair in Toronto prompted local politicians and business leaders to lobby (against heavy opposition) for a permanent Exhibition in Toronto.

On March 11, 1879 the Provincial Legislature passed "An Act to Incorporate the Industrial Exhibition Association of Toronto". A Board of Directors was formed representing the various organizations which had supported a permanent annual Exhibition in Toronto and on September 3rd 1879 the first Toronto Industrial Exhibition opened for a three week run on lands leased by the City of Toronto in what is now Exhibition Place. General admission was 25 cents and more than 100,000 people attended.

The public proclamation announcing the first Exhibition opened with the following: "The City of Toronto having, at a very large outlay, secured new exhibition grounds and buildings, second to none in the Dominion, it has been considered desirable that an annual exhibition, for the promotion of Agriculture, Horticulture, Arts and Industries generally, should be established and held, therein, on a somewhat larger scale than has heretofore been attempted."

50th Anniversary of the Princess Margaret Fountain

Situated at the west end of the grounds across from the Press Building, the Princess Margaret Fountain celebrates its 50th birthday in 2008. The Princess Margaret Fountain, consisting of tiers of three progressively larger circular basins constructed of steel and reinforced concrete, was built to replace the old Gooderham Fountain erected in 1911. The new fountain was dedicated by its namesake, Princess Margaret, sister of Queen Elizabeth II, when she visited the CNE in 1958.

The Princess Margaret Fountain is set in a prominent location at the intersection of Princes' Boulevard, Manitoba Drive and PEI Crescent. Like the Gooderham Fountain before it, the Princess Margaret Fountain has become a favourite place for fair-goers to meet with friends and family.
