Visitors have gathered to see the Hell Drivers and Pageants at the Grandstand, listen to the Coldstream Guards at the Bandshell, participate in the Freckle-Faced Kid competition, play the games and ride the Flyer and the Ferris Wheel on the Midway. Through photographs and artefacts, **The WOW Factor** gives visitors an opportunity to relive the spectacles of the CNE's past and to become part of the historical crowd.

The Sustainable Condo

At Home Pavilion, Hall A, Direct Energy Centre Throughout the Fair



Presented by the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation and EcoSmart, the **Sustainable Condo**TM will be on display at the CNE in the At Home Pavilion throughout the 18 days of the fair.

The Sustainable Condo, a full-size display suite, demonstrates how human comfort and environmental responsibility can be achieved by combining smart, innovative design with state-of-the-art green building technologies, materials and products. Outfitted with green roofs, hot water recovery systems, infloor heating and cooling, raw wool carpeting, the Condo's internal systems and interior designs are green, sustainable and energy efficient.

The Condo has dozens of energy saving appliances, devices and building strategies that can reduce a household's energy and water bills by \$300 to \$400 a year: 1) an energy efficient fridge that uses 28% of the electricity of a conventional fridge, saving almost \$30 a year. 2) an energy and water efficient dishwasher that uses 61% of the energy of a conventional dishwasher and half the amount of water, saving almost \$20 a year 3) an energy and water efficient combined clothes washer and dryer that uses only 10% of the energy and 25% of the water of conventional models.

Water efficient appliances, fixtures, and landscaping that can significantly reduce water use and save you money in the long term: 1) a dual flush toilet that uses 3 and 4 litres of water only as compared to conventional 6 litre toilets 2) low flow showerheads that use less than 6 litres of water per minute compared to over 9 litres for conventional showers 3) a Xero Flor green roofing system that retains and decreases the rate & volume of rainwater runoff from roofscapes.

Renewable, recyclable, durable, and non-toxic products and building materials that are made from local and recycled content sources, including wood from sustainably harvested forests and FSC (Forest Stewardship Council) wood for the millwork and flooring of the condo, from sustainably harvested forests.

The **Tom Bishop's 4B Ranch Trick Riding Show** is back by popular demand this summer at the CNE. Tom Bishop Sr. made his CNE debut in 1959 and the Bishop show's most recent appearance at the EX was in 2005. Hailing from the ranch country in the surrounding foothills of Calgary, Alberta, the 4 Ranch Trick Riders have all grown up in cowboy country and learned their skills naturally from previous generations of performers. Trick Riding is a highly skilled athletic art, which was introduced to North America at the Chicago World's Fair, when the Russian Cossack riders performed to packed houses. The cowboys and cowgirls in audiences were very impressed and were soon practicing stunts and tricks with daredevil aplomb back home on the range.

Tom Bishop's 4-B Ranch Trick Riding Show performers who are appearing at the CNE are frequently retained by the film industry to perform their magic for some of Hollywood's most exciting films. They have been involved in the TV series *Road to Avonlea*, the *Salem Witch Trials* and the film *Eloise* with Julie Andrews. Both Tom Bishop Sr. and Jr. are professional motion picture stuntmen. Tom Bishop Sr. has stunt doubled for Mel Gibson, Kris Kristopherson, Christopher Reeves and Paul Gross on the CBS Series *Due South*.

CNE Automotive Building

Ongoing daily


Just minutes away from the intense urban landscape of Toronto, rural Ontario comes to life for 18 days at the CNE in the historic Automotive Building. The CNE's Farm provides visitors with the chance to slow down and get acquainted with rural life including a wide variety of farm yard animals ranging from piglets to ostriches. Guests can be a farmer for a day, picking apples off a tree, digging for potatoes, milking a cow and collecting eggs from the chickens.

There will also be daily demonstrations of butter making, weaving, rope making, sheep shearing and cow & goat milking. The highly popular butter sculpting returns to the Farm this year as does the 50 ton sand sculpting display. The Farm has been a central part of the CNE the past 17 years, and has called the Automotive Building its home for the last seven years. This year, all food service is being moved outside to the front of the building so as to reduce the potential spread of enteric pathogens.

Kids' AqVenture

New at the farm this year is a colourful and engaging interactive area, designed for children ages three to twelve. In a journey that takes them through five miniature barns, kids get to experience the life of a farm hand. Each barn provides visitors with "hands on" tasks related to planting crops and tending of animals. For example, at the chicken coop, the farm hands feed the chickens the grain they "harvested" and then collect the eggs. At the dairy barn, the children milk a cow and collect milk cartons. There is also a tractor area, sheep barn, orchard/garden and grain area.





After the children have gone through each of the miniature barns and collected their products, they "sell" them at the market for "cash" which they use to purchase a small item. (I.e. Cow ruler or pig eraser)

Sowing the Seeds of Heritage: Life in a Rural Community

10 am to 6 pm daily

An interactive exhibit featuring the history of agriculture and small town life. This exhibit focuses on the Life in a Rural Community as seen through the church, school, rail station, homestead, general store and farm. This exhibit has been developed by the museums of the York/Durham Association of Museums and Archives, featuring the Scugog Shores Museum, Clarington Museums, Cannington Centennial Museum, Sunderland District Museum, Oshawa Community Museum, Whitchurch-Stouffville Museum, Georgina Pioneer Village, King Township Museum and Pickering Museum Village.




Restaurants

CHANGES TO THE CNE SITE IN 2007

BMO Field Soccer Stadium

The new soccer stadium, which was under construction during last year's CNE, will be completed by the end of April 2007. Designed by Brisbon Brook Bynon, Architects and constructed by PCL Design Contractors Inc., the \$62.8 million soccer-specific facility seats 20,000 people

The stadium was part of Canada's sucessful bid to host the 2007 FIFA U-20 World Cup. The original plan was that the site was to be located at York University, with the university contributing \$15 million toward the cost of the new stadium. However, the university was forced to back out in May 2005. The eventual site was moved to the location of demolished Exhibition Stadium and then-existing Sports Hall of Fame building. The stadium is owned by the City of Toronto and is operated by Maple Leaf Sports and Entertainment, owners of the Toronto Football Club and various other sports franchises including the Toronto Maple Leafs, and the Toronto Raptors.

There will be two Toronto FC soccer games during the CNE dates: the first on Saturday, August 18th and the second on Saturday, August 25, 2007. What will be in the stadium for the rest of the 16 CNE days, is still to be determined. The game against Los Angeles featuring David Beckham takes place on Sunday, August 5th, before the CNE opens. As a "soccer only" stadium, the CNE is very limited as to what it can program on the highly sensitive turf, given that putting down a floor over the turf involves astronomical labour costs.

Consolidation of West End Gates

The two CNE gates at the west end of the grounds, formerly situated by the Dufferin Gate and at British Columbia Road immediately north of Liberty Grand, will be consolidated into one gate which will be located on Saskatchewan Road immediately north of MUZIK (the Horticulture Building). It will be called

the **Saskatchewan Gate**. The creation of the new gate means that both the entrances to the MUZIK nightclub and Medieval Times, will be located outside the CNE Gates. Furthermore, the Labour Day Parade will also come to an end outside of the west end CNE entrance. Dufferin Street from Lakeshore Blvd to the Dufferin Gate remains closed to traffic.

The Farm

As of August 2007, there will be no "food service" in the Farm, which is once again situated in the Automotive Building this year. Hence, the building will no longer be called Farm, *Food* & Fun. The removal of food service from the premises is a precautionary measure that has been put in place to alleviate the potential risk of enteric pathogens. The Kitchen Theatre, which was formerly located in the Automotive Building, will be move outside in front of the building on Princes' Boulevard.

Food Building Stage/TTC Buskers Stage

The Food Building Stage, as it was known over the past two years, will not exist in 2007. The Rising Star Competition (Preliminaries, Quarter Finals, and Semi-Finals, will take place on the Kids World Stage, while the finals will remain at the Bandshell); Mike Mandell (the hypnotist) will perform on the Midway Stage. The TTC Stage, situated just west of the Food Building, will host the TTC Buskers auditions during the first three days of the fair as in the past, and then it is envisioned that various street performers will perform on this stage for the remaining 15 days of the CNE. A Lego Tower will occupy the area formerly taken up by the Food Building Stage.

MAJOR ANNIVERSARIES

Music Building ~ 100th Anniversary (used for Green Programs in 2007)

Originally named the Railways Building, this structure showcased displays mounted by Grand Trunk, Canadian Northern and Canadian Pacific Railways. It was designed in 1907 by George W. Gouinlock, a Toronto architect. In 1968, the building was used for music competitions and soon became known as the Music Building. In 1985, the building was designated as historically significant under the Ontario Heritage Act. A major fire in 1987 gutted the building but its exterior has since been restored to its original condition.

Horticultural Building (now MUZIK) ~ 100th Anniversary

The Horticulture Building was constructed in 1907 to replace the Crystal Palace, which had burned to the ground the previous year. Until recently, the Horticulture Building was used for agricultural, horticultural and floricultural displays. The steel and glass dome on this building bears a strong resemblance to that of the nearby Medieval Times Building

Princes Gates ~ 80th Anniversary

The Princes' Gates, designed by the architectural firm of Chapman & Oxley, were opened in 1927 by H.R.H. Edward, Prince of Wales and his brother, Prince George. Since that time, the Princes' Gates have become a symbol of the Canadian National Exhibition. The nine pillars on either side of the centre arch of the gates represent the participating provinces of Confederation (Newfoundland joined Confederation in 1949). The figure at the top of the arch, the "Goddess of Winged Victory," was sculpted by Charles McKechnie and underwent

major restoration in 1987. The Princes' Gates were designated as historically significant under the Ontario Heritage Act later that same year.

Queen Elizabeth Building ~ 50th Anniversary

This structure was to have been called the Women's Building but the name was changed to honor H.M. Queen Elizabeth II. Since the building opened in 1957, it has been used to house the administrative offices of the CNE Association and The Board of Governors of Exhibition Place. The structure also houses the Queen Elizabeth Theatre and an Exhibit Hall, both of which are available for use throughout the year.

Better Living Centre ~ 45th Anniversary

In 1962 the Better Living Centre was built on the site of the Manufacturer's Building which had burned down earlier that year. Designed by Marani, Morris and Allan, The Better Living Centre was intended to reflect a modern functional design recalling the unrelieved white forms, special planning and integration of architecture and landscaping explored in the European Exhibition Halls of the 1920s and 1930s. Designed to take the homeowner and consumer into the modern age, The Better Living Centre is now home to the CNE Casino and SportZone during the 18 days of the fair.

Direct Energy Centre (formerly the National Trade Centre) ~ 10th Anniversary

The Direct Energy Centre is the largest trade show facility in Canada and the third largest in North America. Offering extraordinary flexibility, the facility's 1 million square feet can be subdivided into 10 exhibit halls. It also boasts 24 meeting rooms, a 100 seat presentation theatre and a 6200 seat arena. Designed by Zeidler Roberts Partnership Architects and Dunlop Farrow Inc. Architects in joint venture, and constructed by PCL-Design Contractors Inc., the trade centre opened in 1997.
