

### Ontario Line - 2021 - 2030

• Project Scope – Subway between Ontario Place & Ontario Science Centre

Exhibition Walkshed and Projections Estimated peak-hour ridership

- •12,100 total
- •8,400 boardings
- •3,700 alightings
- •6,300 transfers to/from Lakeshore West GO

Serving Exhibition Place guests, and the Liberty Village, South Parkdale and Niagara neighbourhoods, 12,100 residents and 17,600 jobs will be within a comfortable 10-minute walk. Exhibition is projected to be the third-busiest Ontario Line station.



# Project Scope – Build an additional 400 Room Hotel Tower plus a new Performance Venue in Lot 851

- Removal of the Tornado Substation in Lot 851 - 2022
  - Re-routing of underground hydro to World sub-station location in lot 852
- Upgrade Water & Sewer lines in Lot 852 - 2022
- NBW to become 2-way street from LS to Princes' – 2023-2024
- Construction Period 2023 -2026


# Gardiner Expressway Rehabilitation-2023-2026

- Project Scope Replace the Deck Structure from Dufferin to Strachan as well as the Bent Sub-Structures
- Lot 854 North used for laydown activity and contractor access
- Lot 857 No longer in use for EP from January 2023 onward
- All storage out of this area including Tenants (CNE, Parks, EP & TPSMU in the fall of 2022 after CNE) to be re-located where possible
- Lot 858 No use or storage 4 years (returns in 2027)




# Gardiner Expressway Rehabilitation- 2023-2026






Gardiner Timeline – This is Section 2: Dufferin to Strachan

# Ontario Line South Civil Work - 2023-2027

### Project Scope – Ontario Line Project

Infrastructure Ontario and Metrolinx have awarded a fixed-price contract to <u>Ontario Transit</u>
 <u>Group</u> for \$6B (\$5.5B for capital costs and \$0.5B for financing and transaction costs) to design, build and finance the Ontario Line Southern Civil, Stations and Tunnel (South Civil) package.

#### Scope of work

- A six-kilometre tunnel and associated tunnelling works from Exhibition to Don Yard portal (west of the Don River)
- Groundworks required to build the tunnels and stations; utility and conduit works to prepare for the RSSOM mechanical and electrical systems; guideway structures and facilities to prepare for the track structure to be installed by the RSSOM contractor
- Stations: Exhibition, Osgoode, (King/Bathurst, Queen/Spadina, Moss Park, Corktown, and Queen stations.



### Ontario Place 2.0 - 2024-2030

Project Scope – Following the 2019 Call for Development, three successful partners were selected as part of a multi-partnered approach to redeveloping the Ontario Place site

- Therme Group
- Live Nation
- Écorécréo Group (No Longer Part of the Project)

As the province works with the City of Toronto and Indigenous communities, these three partners will help to deliver a spectacular Ontario Place that provides year-round entertainment for all ages and interests. Through this partnership, Ontario Place will achieve its full potential as a tourism driver and economic generator.





# Ontario Place 2.0 - 2024-2030

#### Green space and public access

A redeveloped Ontario Place will not include casinos or condos and the land will not be sold. Ontario Place is an important part of this province's history and the land will remain in provincial ownership.

Ontario Place will remain open to the public 365 days a year, with free public access and a waterfront experience that can be enjoyed by all.









Ontario Place will remain open while work is underway. Trillium Park and the William G. Davis Trail will continue to be open for public use.



### Ontario Place 2.0 - 2024-2030

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Ontario Place will remain open to the public 365 days a year, with free public access and a waterfront experience that can be enjoyed by all.

Across the site, the public realm will be enhanced and brought up to modern standards. Key heritage and recreational features of the site will be retained and integrated into the redevelopment, including:

- the Cinesphere
- the pod complex
- the marina
- Trillium Park
- the William G. Davis Trail









Ontario Place will remain open while work is underway. Trillium Park and the William G. Davis Trail will continue to be open for public use.



# Dufferin St. Bridges Replacement - 2024-2028

- Project Scope Replace the two bridges with modern bridges
- Move the Dufferin St. Arch 13m south of current location
- Bridges are in poor condition and in need of replacement end of life
- Grade Raise by 2m to meet required vertical clearance over the Lakeshore West Rail Corridor
- Widening of the existing rail corridor from a 4-track to a 6-track opening
- TTC Dufferin Streetcar Loop


#### Outcomes:

- ✓ Better accommodate vehicles, transit, bicycles and pedestrians
- ✓ Meet rail clearances and to accommodate planned expansion of the rail corridor from four to six tracks
- √ TTC's planned Waterfront Transit Reset Project (Streetcar expansions)



# Dufferin St. Bridges Replacement - 2024-2028





#### **Construction Staging:**

Three (3) construction stages

- ► Stage 1 Full closure of Dufferin Street for relocating arch
- ► Stage 2 & 3 East and west sides of the bridges replaced
- ► Full Closures F.G. Gardiner/Lakeshore West Rail Corridor

Removal of the bridges & girder erection










# Liberty New Street - 2024-2028

- Project Scope New Street connecting Dufferin to Strachan
- Will be used for construction access for Ontario Line
- Will include a MUP & Transit stops at Exhibition (Place) Station














### Ontario Line RSSOM - 2025-2030



Infrastructure Ontario and Metrolinx have awarded a contract to **Connect 6ix** valued at \$9B (\$2.3B for capital costs and \$6.7B for short-term construction financing and transaction costs, train costs and 30-year operations and maintenance, lifecycle, and long-term financing). The Ontario Line RSSOM package is a design, build, finance, operate, maintain contract that covers a 30-year term.

#### Scope of work



- Designing, building, operating and maintaining all track and systems (communications and train control)
- Designing, building, operating and maintaining the Maintenance and Storage Facility (where the trains are stored) and the Operations Control Centre (where staff control train operations and are connected to TTC and GO Transit systems) and backup operations control centre

Exhibition Place

- Working collaboratively with TTC according to future operations and maintenance agreements
- Integrating fare equipment with the PRESTO system



### FIFA 2026 - 2025 - 2026


### Project Scope – Toronto will be a host city for the FIFA World Cup 2026

- The FIFA World Cup generates significant economic, cultural and community benefits for host cities and countries and increases host cities' profiles on the world stage. The significant economic impact anticipated from the event will help sustain Toronto's long-term recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, especially in the hard-hit tourism, hospitality and entertainment sectors.
- FIFA World Cup 2026 will be the first in history to feature 48 teams and to be held in three
  different countries. With up to 10 nations playing in Toronto, Toronto's pride in its diversity and
  multiculturalism will be strengthened, with the event touching all neighbourhoods, building a
  sense of anticipation and camaraderie for the next four years and beyond.
- In 2018, the FIFA World Cup 2026 was awarded to a joint bid by Canada, Mexico and the United States, with 80 matches to be staged across 16 cities in North America, of which 10 matches are expected to be in Canada. In January 2018, City Council endorsed Toronto's participation in the bid to be a host city.

- The Bleacher Build south of BMOF is expected to begin in late 2025 and be completed by April 2026
- March May 2026 Non-Exclusive use of the site by FIFA
- May July 2026 Exclusive use of the site by FIFA



# The Bentway Connector - 2027-2030

• Project Scope – Connecting the Bentway with Exhibition Place under Strachan Ave.



- The Under Gardiner area as a Gateway
- Provide access to major civic public realm projects including Quayside, the Port Lands, Bathurst Quay, Exhibition Place, and Harbourfront Centre








# TTC - Liberty Village Transit Service Improvements- 2023 - 2027




