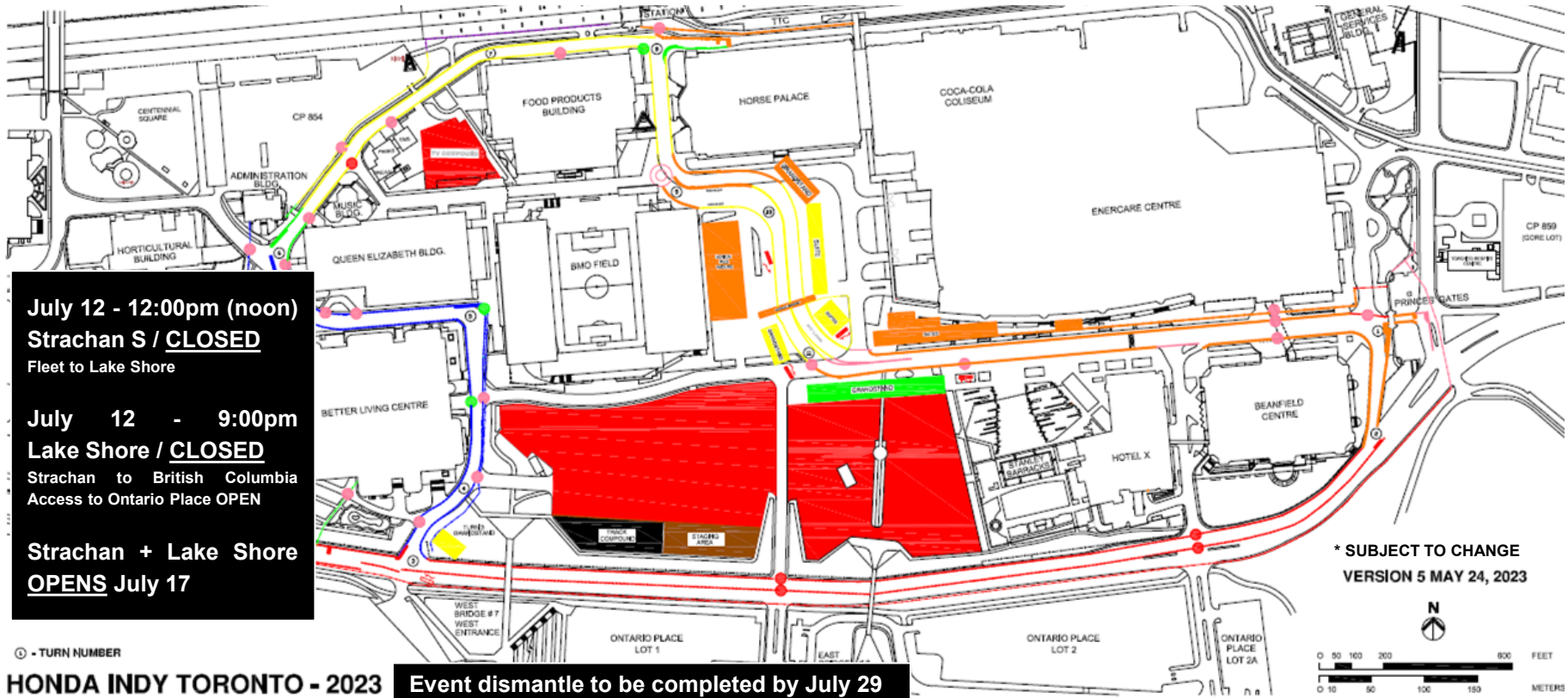

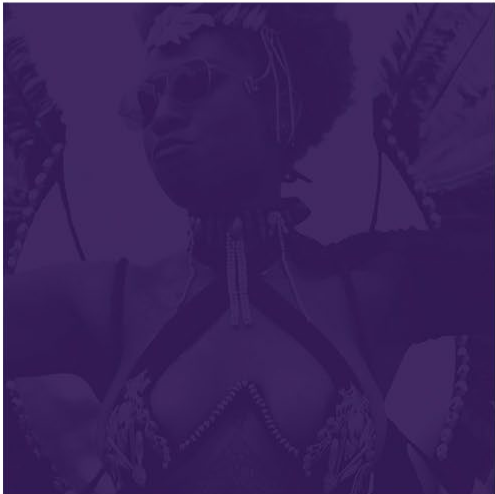

Exhibition Place Event Management Zone

City designation to assist with Traffic Management

The City of Toronto Transportation Services, in partnership with Exhibition Place and MLSE, have designated Exhibition Place an Event Management Zone, similar to the Rogers Centre and Scotiabank Arena.

What this means is City resources are actively looking at ways to improve Traffic during those busy event days at Exhibition Place.

In 2023, the program will focus on Toronto FC Match days at BMO Field where traffic increases significantly for a short period of time.

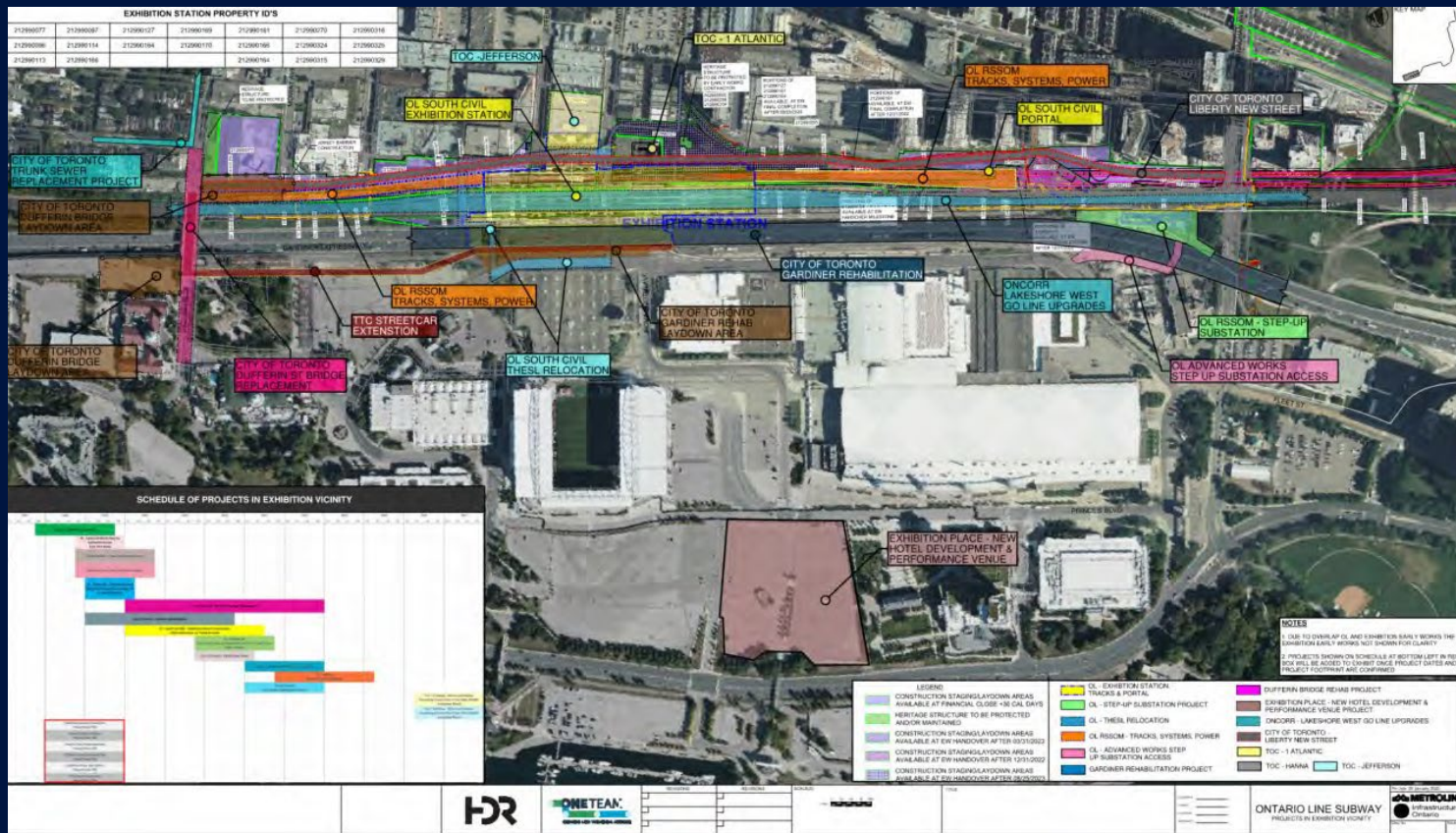
City designation to assist with Traffic Management

What is being done:

- Traffic Signal Timing Changes with increased priority at specific times
- Dedicated Traffic Operations Centre staff focusing on the area using traffic monitoring cameras
- Paid Duty Police & Traffic Wardens focused on priority locations
- Variable Message Signs used for key Event Zone messaging

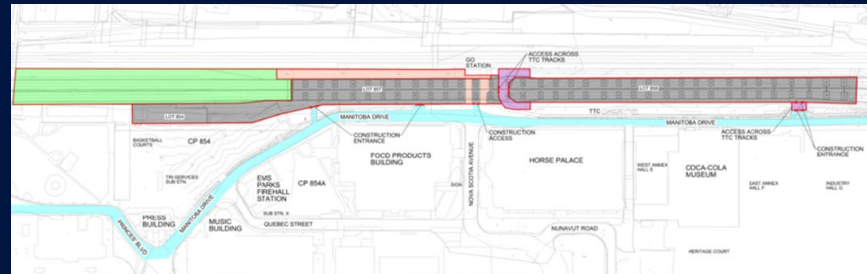

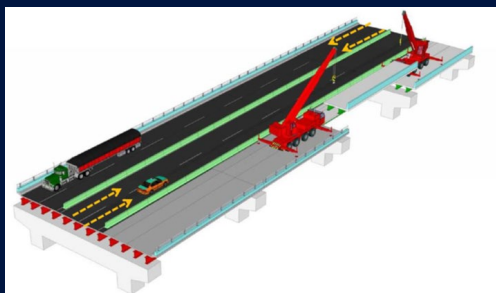

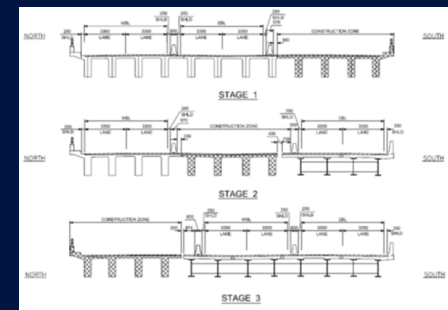
Gardiner Timeline – This is Section 2:

Ontario Line South Civil Work – 2023-2027

Project Scope – Ontario Line Project

- Infrastructure Ontario and Metrolinx have awarded a fixed-price contract to Ontario Transit Group for \$6B (\$5.5B for capital costs and \$0.5B for financing and transaction costs) to design, build and finance the Ontario Line Southern Civil, Stations and Tunnel (South Civil) package.

Scope of work

- A six-kilometre tunnel and associated tunnelling works from Exhibition to Don Yard portal (west of the Don River)
- Groundworks required to build the tunnels and stations; utility and conduit works to prepare for the RSSOM mechanical and electrical systems; guideway structures and facilities to prepare for the track structure to be installed by the RSSOM contractor
- Stations: Exhibition, Osgoode, King/Bathurst, Queen/Spadina, Moss Park, Corktown, and Queen stations



Ontario Place 2.0 – 2024-2030

Project Scope – Following the 2019 Call for Development, three successful partners were selected as part of a multi-partnered approach to redeveloping the Ontario Place site

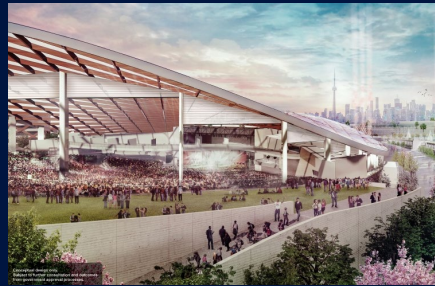

Green space and public access

A redeveloped Ontario Place will not include casinos or condos and the land will not be sold. Ontario Place is an important part of this province's history, and the land will remain in provincial ownership.

Ontario Place will remain open to the public 365 days a year, with free public access and a waterfront experience that can be enjoyed by all.

The Province has submitted their development application to the City for Therme Group's 12 acre portion of the site on November 28, 2022.

Across the site, the public realm will be enhanced and brought up to modern standards. Key heritage and recreational features of the site will be retained and integrated into the redevelopment, including: the Cinesphere, the pod complex, the marina, Trillium Park, and the William G. Davis Trail

Ontario Place will remain open while work is underway. Trillium Park and the William G. Davis Trail will continue to be open for public use.

Dufferin St. Bridges Replacement – 2024-2028

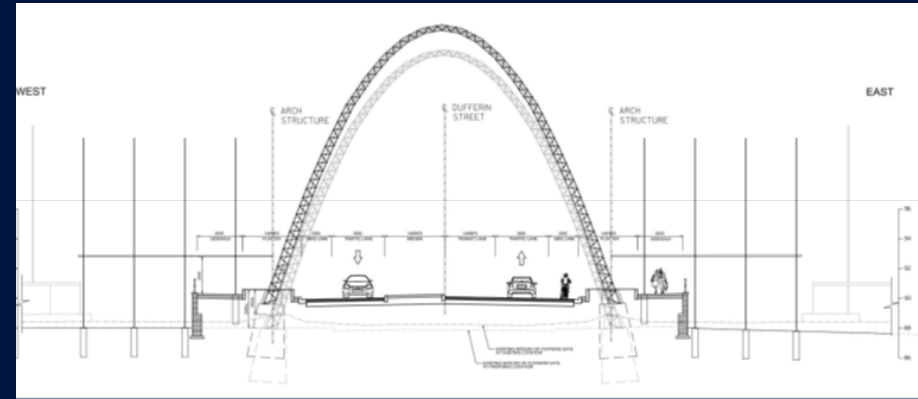
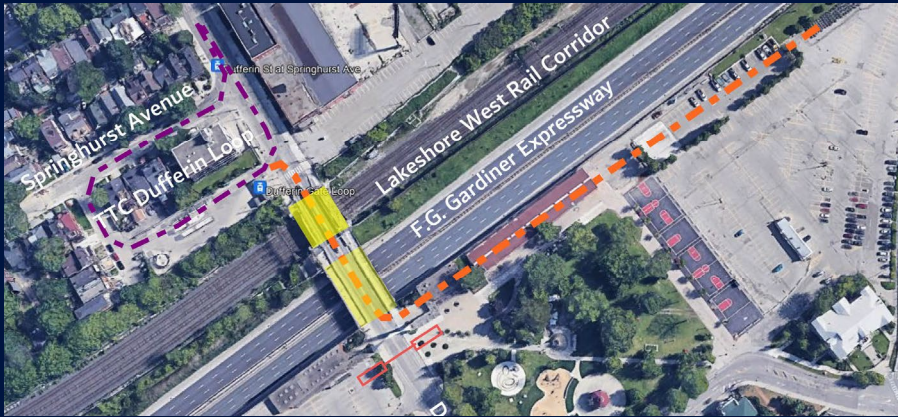
Project Scope – Replace the two bridges with modern bridges

- Move the Dufferin St. Arch 13m south of current location
- Bridges are in poor condition and in need of replacement – end of life
- Grade Raise by 2m to meet required vertical clearance over the Lakeshore West Rail Corridor
- Widening of the existing rail corridor from a 4-track to a 6-track opening
- TTC Dufferin Streetcar Loop

Outcomes:

- ✓ *Better accommodate vehicles, transit, bicycles and pedestrians*
- ✓ *Meet rail clearances and to accommodate planned expansion of the rail corridor from four to six tracks*
- ✓ *TTC's planned Waterfront Transit Reset Project (Streetcar expansions)*

Dufferin St. Bridges Replacement – 2024-2028



Construction Staging:

Three (3) construction stages

- ▶ Stage 1 – Full closure of Dufferin Street for relocating arch
- ▶ Stage 2 & 3 – East and west sides of the bridges replaced
- ▶ Full Closures - F.G. Gardiner/Lakeshore West Rail Corridor

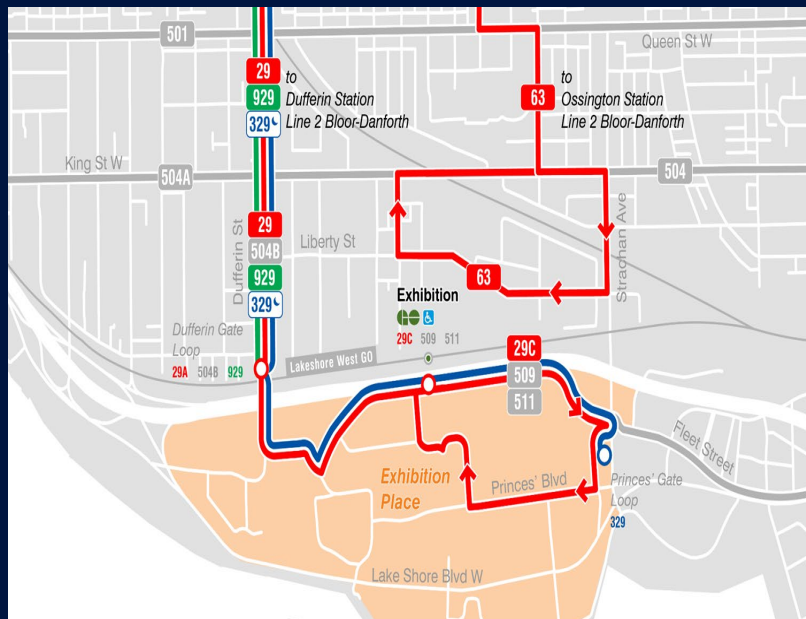

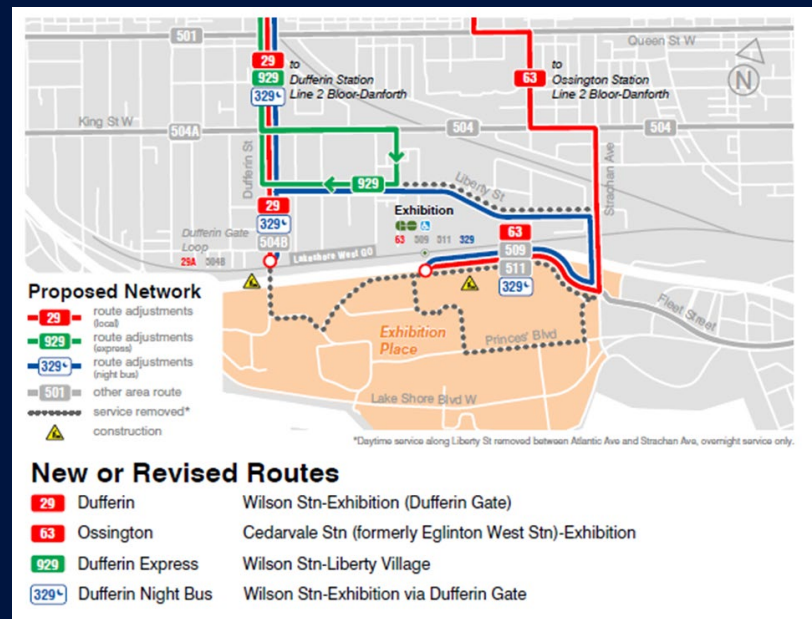
TTC – Liberty Village Transit Service Improvements – 2024-2027

Project Scope – Adjust TTC service to improve consistency of the service to the area during construction up to 2027

Ontario Line RSSOM – 2025-2030



Infrastructure Ontario and Metrolinx have awarded a contract to **Connect 6ix** valued at \$9B (\$2.3B for capital costs and \$6.7B for short-term construction financing and transaction costs, train costs and 30-year operations and maintenance, lifecycle, and long-term financing). The Ontario Line RSSOM package is a design, build, finance, operate, maintain contract that covers a 30-year term.

Scope of work



- Designing, supplying, operating and maintaining the rolling stock (trains)
- Designing, building, operating and maintaining all track and systems (communications and train control)
- Designing, building, operating and maintaining the Maintenance and Storage Facility (where the trains are stored) and the Operations Control Centre (where staff control train operations and are connected to TTC and GO Transit systems) and backup operations control centre
- Working collaboratively with TTC according to future operations and maintenance agreements
- Integrating fare equipment with the PRESTO system

FIFA 2026 – 2025-2026

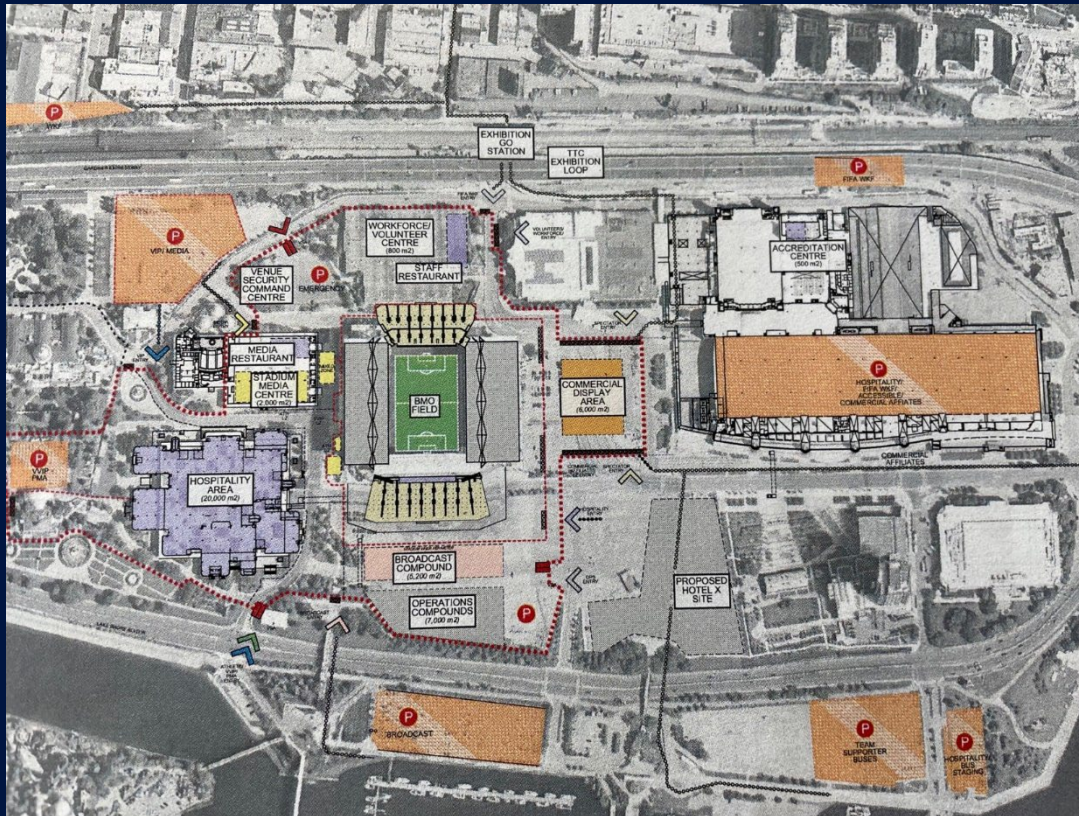
Project Scope – Toronto will be a host city for the FIFA World Cup 2026

- The FIFA World Cup generates significant economic, cultural, and community benefits for host cities and countries, and increases host cities' profiles on the world stage. The significant economic impact anticipated from the event will help sustain Toronto's long-term recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, especially in the hard-hit tourism, hospitality and entertainment sectors.
- FIFA World Cup 2026 will be the first in history to feature 48 teams and to be held in three different countries. With up to 10 nations playing in Toronto, Toronto's pride in its diversity and multiculturalism will be strengthened, with the event touching all neighbourhoods, building a sense of anticipation and camaraderie for the next four years and beyond.
- In 2018, the FIFA World Cup 2026 was awarded to a joint bid by Canada, Mexico, and the United States, with 80 matches to be staged across 16 cities in North America, of which 10 matches are expected to be in Canada. In January 2018, City Council endorsed Toronto's participation in the bid to be a host city.

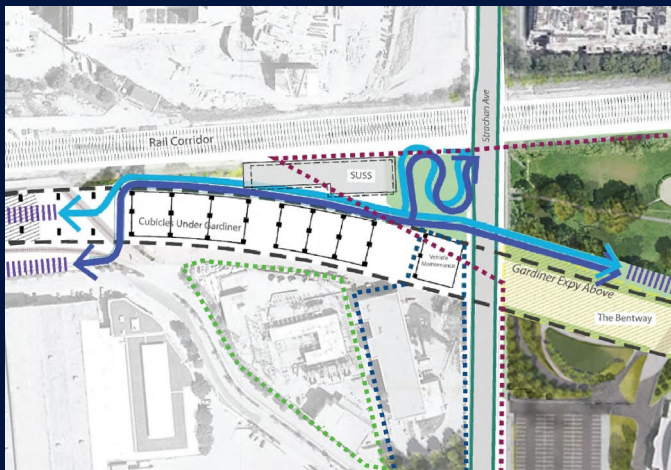
- Exhibition Place & BMO Field = Stadium Campus & Build Out
