Emergency Bridge Closure Dufferin Street Bridge over Metrolinx Rail Corridor


Closure Start Date: Monday, July 10, 2023 Expected Closure End Date: Fall 2023 / Winter 2024* *Timeline is subject to change.

This notice provides an update regarding the emergency work on the Dufferin Street Bridge over the Metrolinx Rail corridor. A comprehensive inspection has revealed that the damage to the bridge is more significant than previously thought. As a result, the City of Toronto has also closed the northbound lane of the bridge. Both the northbound and southbound lanes of the bridge will remain closed until repairs can be made to both structures. The pedestrian bridge on the east side of Dufferin Street currently remains open.

The closure is anticipated to last three to six months but is dependent on a number of factors including the final design, availability of construction material and weather. Given the emergency nature of this work, the repair plan is still in development. More updates will be provided to the community as they become available.

We understand this kind of work can be disruptive. Thank you for your patience while we carry out this emergency work to ensure the safety of all Dufferin Street Bridge users.

Cyclists: Cyclists are asked to please be aware of traffic movements, and obey signs and signals.

The pedestrian bridge on the east side of Dufferin Street currently remains open and people cycling can dismount and use pedestrian bridge.
